Transfer credits will be evaluated and applied according to the current catalog and the approved Essential Studies list at the first semester of enrollment at UND.

One who has completed an AS degree in NURS from NCTC and holds a current RN license may be eligible for the online UND RN to BSN program, see information at www.nursing.und.edu.
